Fostering Agreement

The cat/cats described below is/are in the care of the Quadra Feral Cat Group and Cat Rescue (QCR).

Quadra Feral Cat Group retains the right to make decisions regarding health and treatment while in foster care.

Description of cat(s):

This agreement is between QCR and volunteer fosterers. Policies are those promoted by veterinary professionals and rescue groups.

Policies:

1. Since the cat's safety must be assured, and it is known that cats need time to get oriented to a new location, **I agree to keep the cat indoors**, in a safe place, for the duration of its foster care or until such time as QCR authorizes its release to the outdoors.
2. I agree to spend some time with the cat(s) each day in order to socialize it.
If the cat is to be part of the household and exposed to normal household activity it will just need some handling, several times a day.
If the cat will be in a separate area away from normal household activity and/or if the cat is from a feral background then a more formal schedule needs to be adhered to. We suggest about 2 hr. a day of contact with people which can be spread out over several sessions. The cat may need to be handled frequently to gradually habituate it to people. Short but frequent sessions are recommended if the cat is very timid.
A "tips on socializing kittens" brochure can be provided.
3. The cat(s) should be allowed to free feed or be fed at least twice daily and have access to water at all times.
4. A litter box with litter shall be available at all times, scooped daily, and replaced weekly.

5. If there are children in my household I agree to supervise their interactions with the cat for their safety and for the safety of the cat(s).
6. In the case of small kittens that may have health issues they should be weighed weekly and a log kept to monitor health and ensure they are growing.
We can supply a scale.
7. Respiratory ailments are common in kittens – from time to time medications may be prescribed and need to be administered.
8. Your tetanus vaccinations should be kept up to date.

This agreement is in effect until the following date:

QCR agrees to either remove the cat(s) or extend the duration of the fostering agreement at that time. QCR will also remove the cat(s) before this date if the fosterer wishes to terminate the agreement at any time.
